U.N. SANCTIONS ON 3 LEADERS

The United Nations imposed asset freezes and travel bans on three local leaders in Ivory Coast accused of undermining the peace effort intended to unite the warring south and north of the country. Two of the men, Charles Blé Goudéand Eugène Djué, led young supporters of President Laurent Gbagbo in four days of attacks last month on the bases of United Nations peacekeepers. The third, Fofie Kouakou, is a commander of antigovernment rebel forces.
