RWANDA: MORE JUDGES FOR GENOCIDE COURT The International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda will receive 18 backup judges to help speed up its work prosecuting central figures in the mass killings of ethnic Tutsi and moderate Hutu that took place in Rwanda in 1994. The General Assembly approved the additional judges in an effort to expedite a backlog of cases before the tribunal, which was set up in 1995 in Arusha, Tanzania.
