Schedule an in-district meeting with your Representative in Congress today! Today we are launching a three month campaign urging our elected officials to take action and pass the Sudan Peace, Security, and Accountability Act of 2013 through Congress.

Introduced in April 2013, the bill presents the best opportunity to generate policy that can bring about peace in Sudan through a comprehensive approach. We need to ensure its passage, but the bill is in danger of not gaining the bipartisan support it needs to move to a mark up in committee and pass through the House.

Throughout the August Recess, many Members of Congress will be in their home districts. This is our chance to meet in person with elected officials or their staff and put Sudan back on their agenda.

Especially if you live in a Republican District, please add your important voice to the movement by meeting face-to-face with your Representative to ask for cosponsorship of H.R. 1692.
